### **Carp Care**

Landing nets Arms to be a minimum of 42 inches

**Unhooking mats** Flat mats have to have a retaining flap (aqua combi mat) and are to be of a certain size (1200mm~W~x~50mm~H~x~700mm~D)

Carp cots are to be encouraged

Weigh slings Weigh slings are to have 2 top support bars, ie rigid

#### Carp care kits

Kryston Klin-ik shield gel

Carp care kits sold by fishing manufacturers (Nash, Korda etc)

The following topical Koi products are far superior: Kasuri, Anti-bac and Roccal Wound Cleaner, NT Labs, Ulcer Swab, Propolis (available from Holland and Barratt) The following are instructions for using Propolis:

- Carefully dry the wound as much as possible.
- Spread Propolis onto the wound and put some water on the area.
- Slowly lower the fish back into the water. A waxy waterproof seal will form around the wound.
- Be careful to protect the gills and eyes.

# Westbrook Mere management report

HAVING taken over this role back in the late summer, I've been busy looking at what needs doing, what's urgent and what can wait. Also, discussions within the management committee as to what we want, or need, to do.

So, these are my plans for Westbrook mere going forward. Starting at the boathouse going towards Snooks, we need to reduce the height of the bushes, to about 4ft and then cut annually to that height in the autumn, as well as remove the vegetation hanging in the lake. We need to remove some of the saplings along the way. Bigger trees will be left and dealt with later. This should help with casting and landing fish.

Then there is the bank work to be completed on the first 10 swims, before moving to other swims, and all of this is dependent on finances being available.

I am also looking at improving the inlet from the river so that it doesn't block so easy and maintains good water quality. The list of jobs goes on and on.

As you can see if you've been to the Mere, recently we have been clearing the scrub between swims and regular mowing should help with maintenance, but only time will tell.

I'm not trying to turn the lake into a garden but merely try to reduce the amount of labour needed to maintain the lake in order to give us the best chance of catching fish and not getting caught on overhanging snags. Please remember to only fish from dedicated swims.

who have recently joined:

- Gates must be locked when arriving and leaving. This also goes for otter gates being closed at all times!
- Dip tanks are provided, please make sure you use them on all our water.
- You must have a carp care kit and adequate unhooking mat (sizes are stated in club rules please make sure you read them).
- The halfway rule must be obeyed if you have a fellow angler opposite to you.
- Toilets and shower are provided at Westbrook – please leave them as you find them. Doug does a brilliant job keeping them clean for all of us.
- Scanners are located in the clubhouse to scan fish. These enable us to monitor fish growths,

- but please return them after your session ends.
- Bailiffs numbers are on your club card. If you have any problems on the bank please don't hesitate to call one of us if you need any assistance or you're not sure about anything,
- No wading on any BDAS waters.
- Fish care must be top priority at all times. Retainers may be used for short periods of time to enable you to weigh and take pictures of your catch, but fish may not be retained over night.
- Leadcore or any type of leader may not be used on any BDAS waters.

Please do read your club rules, have a great season and see you on the bank.

# Pixies Mere lake managers' report

A GREAT year at Pixies Mere, with lots of projects completed.

The car park and tracks have seen more than 36 tonnes of type 1 laid down, improving the access around the lake and car park areas.

We have widened the track around to the rear car park, making it easier to get round. The rear car park has now been defined by a border of logs.

The container has been moved, giving extra parking.

Swims have been rebuilt and made safe and this is on-going with lots more to do this year.

Marginal planting has started around the bowl area, with reeds and carex being planted.

The toilet has been moved besides the main site office and is emptied and cleaned every month. Please keep this clean as it's for all to use.

Bridges have been repaired and made safe. The gates have been repaired and given a facelift.

As for the fishing, it's starting to show that

the reduction in carp numbers has had a positive effect, with weight gain in the remaining fish and the condition of the carp improved massively. Also, it's good to see many of you fishing for the other species – Pike, Bream, etc.

The club has made the investment in buying 12 complete sets of coarse fishing equipment for the planned youth events to be held at Pixies this year. I think you will all agree that getting more young anglers on the bank is vital for the club's future.

With a busy year ahead and with lots more to do, we will be looking for volunteers to help. We would like to thank the members that gave their time this past year to help and support when it was needed.

LAST year started with five large trees coming down around the lake. We had a great response from members to come and help remove the trees and get the lake back open again. Some of the trees had come down and damaged the fence and new dip baths we were installing, which we repaired over the next few weeks.

The work party saw a good tidy up on the banks and the donated shed repaired and assembled on the lake. The weed came up steadily over the hot summer. The fish that were caught over the year were all putting on weight and looking lovely. Largest reported fish was a lovely 30lb Mirror caught by Lee Climpson.

The end of August saw us having to shut the lake again with some unexpected fish deaths. We have worked closely with Martin Van Heerden from the environment agency on the cause and the best course of action in moving forward. The main thing we established is that there was no virus that could spread to other lakes.

We have a few jobs lined up for the next coming year and so look forward to seeing you on the bank.
